# Ramadhan Zakat Disbursement

The festive spirit of Ramadhan thrived at Muslim Converts' Association of Singapore (MCAS) as 575 underprivileged families received financial assistance and sponsored goodie bags totalling more than \$225,000 in value.

The Guest-of-Honour for the Ramadhan Zakat Disbursement 2017, Madam Halimah Yacob, graced the ceremony by presenting the financial aid to several beneficiaries at MCAS.

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Over more than two decades, this annual drive by MCAS has been helping the poor and needy during the fasting month and for their upcoming Eid (Hari Raya) celebration.

Every beneficiary on that day received \$255 from Zakat and NTUC FairPrice vouchers of \$110 from Fidyah. These families have been selected to receive this assistance due to reasons that include low income, chronic illness, and old age.

# Ramadhan ZAKAT disbursement

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This year, for the first time, the beneficiaries also received sponsored products such as meat from Zac Butchery, as well as foods and beverages from other sponsors such as Al-Wadi Restaurant, Suhaimi Yusof, Asia Farm F&B Pte Ltd, and Hjh Maimunah Restaurant. The total value of products in each goodie bag was about \$30.

MCAS's financial assistance programme extends to other months of the year, and includes short-term monthly assistance to selected families with financial difficulties, as well as organising motivational talks and budgeting workshops for them.







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# Jewels of the *Praiseworthy*Muslim (1) -*Knowledge* ('Ilm)

We can be successful human beings only by being humans – purely. The key to success in humanity begins with the human's need to embrace and enjoin humanitarian values.

For instance, this is when the powerful protects the weak, the wealthy rescues the poor, and the intelligent guides and educates. We are in a state of least humanness when the powerful oppresses the weak, the wealthy exploits or ignores the poor, and the intelligent deceives or manipulates.

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Being human, first of all, requires that we have the knowledge about what humanity is, and then work on it upon our human meaning.

Knowledge ('Ilm) is issued from the Creator for humans to gather and benefit from, which is vital for life. In its essential nature, knowledge is goodness and the true seeker of knowledge must strive for goodness in his human nature.

"And by the soul and by Him Who perfectly proportioned it and imbued it with (the consciousness of) its evil and its piety. He who purifies it (soul) will prosper and he who suppresses (soul) it will be ruined." (Ash-Shams, Q91:07-10)

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Muslims are taught to inculcate sincerity to such an extent that our innermost intention (niyat) to seek knowledge must be pure. This means seeking knowledge solely for the sake of obedience to Allah's command and His Messenger's advice. This



obedience thus manifests Faith (Iman) and makes us be true to our nature as humans. We then need to maintain the goodness in our nature through our character (akhlaq) and excel in being human.

Knowledge is essential to humans in living life, and it must be pursued constantly and consistently.

"Allah will raise to high ranks those of you who believe and are endowed with knowledge." (Al-Mujadalah, Q58:11)

Furthermore, Prophet Muhammed (SAW) said, "The seeking of knowledge is obligatory for every Muslim." (At-Tirmidhi).

# IS THERE A GUIDE FROM THE QURAN ON HOW WE SHOULD INTERACT ON SOCIAL MEDIA?





The widespread use of social media platforms like Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram, has enabled us to be connected to larger audiences quicker and easier. Information is highly accessible and can be published anonymously. This surely has implications on the way we interact as Muslims, and as social media users.

The Islamic Tradition has undoubtedly shed light in detail on the etiquette of interaction as revealed in Surah Al-Hujurat (Q49). In verse 6, Allah (SWT) commands: "O you who have believed, if there comes to you a disobedient one with information, investigate, lest you harm a people out of ignorance and become, over what you have done, regretful".

Acting responsibly with the information in hand is extremely vital to prevent people from being misled - now especially, judging by the amount of fake news being shared and retweeted.


Facebook comments sections have also transformed into battlefields. We find hurtful jibes and vicious name-calling between users.

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# Allah (SWT) reveals in verse II:

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"O you who have believed, let not a people ridicule [another] people; perhaps they may be better than them; nor let women ridicule [other] women; perhaps they may be better than them. And do not insult one another and do not call each other by [offensive] nicknames. Wretched is the name of disobedience after [one's] faith. And whoever does not repent then it is those who are the wrongdoers".



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Picture postings on social media could also be interpreted in the wrong light by some users. These unverified perceptions may end up as fodder for gossip.

Regarding this, Allah (SWT) instructs in verse 12:

"O you who have believed, avoid much [negative] assumption. Indeed, some assumption is sin. And do not spy or backbite each other. Would one of you like to eat the flesh of his brother when dead? You would detest it. And fear Allah; indeed, Allah is Accepting of repentance and Merciful".

These Quranic verses - a guidance relevant for all times and places - when applied would greatly improve the quality of interaction between users and create a positive environment for all. May we continue to be merciful netizens who spread peace and love.

Known as Meals on Wheels (MOW), this annual event was graced by Member of Parliament for MacPherson SMC, Ms Tin Pei Ling.

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It is an honour for the MCAS team to have Ms Tin Pei Ling join the list of official guests who have kindly graced the events held by MCAS and hearteningly motivated the volunteers and staff to keep up the efforts in uplifting the spirit of the community.

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For MCAS, building the bridges of peace and harmony especially with friends and guests of other faiths is a significant effort that fosters better understanding between Muslims and non-Muslims, as well as portrays one of the many forms of kindness taught by Prophet Muhammad (SAW).

The MOW charity package, including cash and kind from corporate sponsorships and personal donations, was worth about \$245 each.







For seven years, MOW has been MCAS's annual community service project, managed by DACCnDAYS students and volunteers. MOW seeks to lighten the financial burden of the underprivileged in our community through the distribution of groceries in the spirit of the blessed month of Ramadhan, which was a month away.

This year, with the exciting new collaboration with CDAC, MOW has reached out to a record-breaking 160 families, both Muslims and non-Muslims.



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# Seafaring **Explorer** Admiral Zheng He Nur Izzati Soonaan


China's greatest seafaring explorer, Admiral Zheng He, was born in 1371, in Hedai Village, in Yunnan. He was the second son of Ma Haji, a prominent Muslim leader of his local southwestern Chinese community.

Growing up, Zheng He studied Islam and was very much influenced by his father's strong character, great military mind and altruistic nature. Originally named "Ma He", his Arabic name was recorded as Haji Mahmud Shams.

In 1402, Zheng He was appointed as Admiral of the Treasure Fleet, commanding 317 ships and 27,870 men – among them were sailors, clerks, interpreters, soldiers, artisans, medicine men and meteorologists. Zheng He's fleet was self-sufficient as it included command ships, warships, treasure ships, horse ships, grain ships and even water tankers.

Zheng He's invincible fleet visited about 37 countries during the 7 voyages in 28 years. Advanced Chinese know-how and technology in ceramics-making, metallurgy, weaving, shipbuilding, construction, fishery, agriculture, tea-planting and medicine were

also passed on to the native hosts. Today, fishermen in Kochin and Calicut in Kerala, India, are still using Chinese fishing nets which they call "cheenavala" (China net).

During his last voyage, Zheng He took the opportunity to send several Muslim crew members to Mecca to perform the Hajj (Major Pilgrimage). In 1433, Zheng He fell ill and passed away off Calicut, India. A tomb was built in his honour in Nanjing, the Ming capital of China. In modern-day China, II July is 'Maritime Day', devoted to the memory of Zheng He's first voyage.

"O you who believe! Fear Allah, and let every soul look to what (provision) he has sent forth for the morrow. Indeed, fear Allah for Allah is well-acquainted with (all) that you do." (Al-Hashr, Q59:18)

All believers are commanded to develop righteousness and take stock of the type of deeds we are sending for the morrow i.e. the hereafter.

## Our deeds depend on:

- I) Intention: Am I trying to live for the sake of Allah
- 2) Allah's Grace and Mercy: If I am living for His sake, Insha'Allah, He will overlook my shortcomings

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Our intention is one of the two most important things. Muhammed (SAW) said that all actions are judged on its intention. Allah (SWT) warns us against worshipping Him with ulterior motives:

"Those who do good deeds only to be seen (of men)." (Al-Ma'un, Q107:6)

One needs to be cautious and keep a constant look over the ego. It is good to be ambitious but be mindful because it can lead us down the wrong path as Allah (SWT) says in Surah Al-Zukhruf:

"If anyone withdraws himself from remembrance of (Allah) Most Gracious, We appoint for him an evil one, to be an intimate companion to him. Such (evil ones) really hinder them from the Path, but they think that they are being guided aright!" (Q43:36-37)

Always try to adopt two things throughout your life: increase the amount of good that you are sending before you and try to wipe out the blemishes from your Book. It is a simple recipe but it has an everlasting effect.
