
As we continue bridging the communities, *Insha'Allah*, we shall remind each other:






Membership stood at **2,244** as at 31 December.

Converts represent more than two-thirds of the Ordinary/Life Membership which is in compliance with Clause 4 (f) of the Constitution.




### MEMBERSHIP FROM 2013 - 2015

### ERP SOLUTION


On 22 November 2014, Ex-Co approved the award for the tender of the Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) solution covering Accounting Software, Bookshop and Membership System, to AFON Technologies Pte Ltd for a project amount of \$150,000 excluding GST. The Association had been awarded a grant of \$35,299.83 from National Council of Social Service for this project.

The Executive Committee also appointed PKF-CAP Ignite Pte Ltd as the project manager to oversee this project. A Council member, Abdul Razak Isa, a director of PKF-CAP Ignite Pte Ltd was not present when the Executive Committee deliberated and decided on this appointment. The contract sum was \$29,700.


### IT AUDIT



## ONE-STOP CENTRE FOR CONVERTS (OSCC)



In 2015, MCAS as a One-Stop Centre for Converts continued to facilitate the issuance of the following:

- Conversion Card
- Conversion Kit
- Reimbursements of fees for
  - transport
  - circumcision
  - charges incurred upon insertion of Muslim name in identity card for Singaporeans

All Converts and prospective Converts were encouraged to attend the Knowing Islam Session, Beginners' Course on Islam and Solat Tutorial prior to making an appointment for conversion.

On the day of conversion, the Converts were personally invited to participate in the upcoming activities and attend the talks that would be organised by MCAS. This was part of the efforts to build a strong relationship with the Converts as well as encouraging them to continue attending more classes that were made available for them in MCAS.

## PROJECT TOUCHING HEARTS (PTH) (BEFRIENDING SCHEME)



The PTH was a support programme piloted by the CDD for potential Converts attending the Beginners' Course on Islam (BCI). All Befrienders who signed up for PTH underwent specialised training to help on issues regarding conversion right through the process of embracing Islam.

In 2015, PTH conducted 3 weekday and 3 weekend Befriending Cycles. The weekend cycles saw positive and active participation from the BCI students. Befrienders assisted with the slide presentations and group discussions.

PTH paved the way for the Befrienders to establish good rapport with the students as it aimed to ensure that the prospective Converts and partners have good social support at MCAS. It also encouraged them to attend other classes and workshops to benefit their journey in Islam.

## PASTORAL CARE PROGRAMME (PCP)

The PCP was a 'personalised support system' for the new Converts that linked the Converts and the Muslim community at large. When a Convert embraced Islam, a Befriender (also known as Mentor) was assigned to a new Convert to guide and to facilitate the Convert's journey as a new Muslim.

The Mentors channelled the Converts to the established resources of MCAS including: educational services, social events, financial assistance, counselling services, enrichment programmes, legal advice, and more. The Mentors were empowered to lead based on clusters: North Sector, East Sector, South Sector, West Sector, Central 1 Sector and Central 2 Sector, depending on the Converts' residence.

The Mentors, within their respective sectors, organised social activities and bonding sessions in Mosques. The PCP programme hoped that these Converts would extend their support to the other new Converts in future.

In 2015, a total of 417 (62%) out of 670 Converts opted to be in the PCP.

## WELCOME TO ISLAM PROGRAMME (WTI)

The WTI programme was developed to facilitate interaction amongst new Converts and other volunteers.

Its overall aim was to allow new Converts (and family) to be comfortable with Islam through socialising, networking and interactions.

In the WTI programme, Converts were introduced and invited to MCAS educational classes, social visits to Mosques/Islamic organisations, participate in Islamic workshops and other enrichment activities.

There were also several up and close discussions organised for the Converts, known as the In-Conversation series with Converts, where they had dialogues with learned scholars, such as the Mufti of Singapore, Dr Fatris Bakaram.



# Religious guidance & da'wah activities





In 2015, ED embarked on The New Learning Pathway, which offers a clear and progressive learning opportunity to all students, primarily the Converts. With this initiative, ED restructured all lessons' content. Marketing initiatives, such as an introductory video, posters, and course information booklet, had been made available for dissemination.

Referring to this, students now can chart their progress of learning about Islam and participate in the courses corresponding to their level of knowledge.

### *Advance*

Learners will develop analytical understanding of Islam through a Diploma certification course, as well as appreciate the knowledge-seeking tradition of the scholars (Ulama).

### *Intermediate*

Learners will appreciate extended knowledge in various tenets of Islam. Learners will also be introduced to the Science of Prophetic Traditions (Ahadith).

### *Enhancement*

Learners will strengthen previously acquired knowledge. They will also learn supererogatory worships and gain deeper religious insights into Prophetic history.

### *Foundation*

Learners will acquire foundational knowledge on Islamic faith and its main ritual practices, and the wisdom behind practices.

## ENHANCEMENT LEVEL COURSES

Learners would deepen previously acquired knowledge from the Foundation Level.







## DIPLOMA IN ISLAMIC STUDIES PROGRAMME (DISP)



The DISP was conducted by the International Islamic University of Malaysia (IIUM) and had been organised in Singapore by MCAS since the year 2000. The programme was offered with English as the medium of instruction, and all the lecturers were from IIUM. Opened to both Muslims and non-Muslims, its objective was to provide quality content to the overall concepts of Islam and an exposure to the Islamic overview. All participants, who successfully completed the course and fulfilled its requirements, received a diploma awarded by IIUM. The 15th intake started in 2015 with 47 students, including 7 Converts, and they were expected to complete the course in October 2016.

## RAMADHAN CAMPAIGN

Collaborating with Islamic Religious Council of Singapore (MUIS), ED participated in the Ramadhan Campaign by organising Solat Refresher Courses at three mosques and at MCAS, reaching out to 300 students.

## INDIVIDUAL PERSONAL COACHING (IPC)

The IPC was provided for students who had irregular working hours, travelled frequently, and required a language other than English as the medium of instruction, or were on a very short stay in Singapore. The IPC was conducted at the mutual convenience of the teacher and the student. In 2015, 206 students had been assigned a teacher for IPC.

## STAYING MARRIED — STAYING IN LOVE

This programme helped participants to rekindle the passion in their marriage and introduced the fundamentals towards amplifying their love, simplifying their differences and applications on how to strengthen their bond. In 2015, 21 couples attended the programme on 14 April, 1 August and 12 December.



## EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION SKILLS



This workshop covered topics on how to impart the skills of communication, develop more confidence, and be more articulate when discussing issues within the Islamic community at large. Ust Saif-ur-Rahman shared his experiences with 60 participants who attended the workshop on 14 February.

## BUILDING INTER FAMILY TIES

There were 45 participants (couples with their families) who attended this workshop that guided them through concerns in inter-racial marriage. They learnt to understand and respect family culture, upbringing and traditions, as well as customs of their partners' and families, as Islam celebrates diversity and mutual love. The workshops were conducted on 14 March, 30 May and 19 September.

## COMMUNICATING & BEFRIENDING IN ISLAM

This interactive workshop provided theoretical and practical tips on how to be an effective communicator. Ust Saif-ur-Rahman conducted the workshop for 70 participants, half of whom were Converts. Other participants included students, befrienders and volunteers, who gained knowledge on effective questioning skills, emphatic listening abilities as well as proper articulation of situational responses. The workshop was conducted on 13 June.

## INTERNALISING & UNDERSTANDING ISLAM



Two sessions were held respectively on: 'Refreshing My Relationship with Allah' and 'Journeys into Islam'. A total of about 180 participants attended both sessions delivered by Ust Saif-ur-Rahman, on 21 March and 6 June. It had attracted non-Muslims - 30% of attendees - who were interested to know about Islam before embracing it.

## THE BEAUTY OF ISLAM

### PUBLIC TALKS & PUBLIC FORUM

In 2015, there were 3 Public Talks and 1 Public Forum organised at various public venues. The objectives of these talks were to engage, create awareness and convey the message of Islam with astuteness and in an appealing manner to the non-Muslims, new Muslims and born Muslims, who were seeking deeper knowledge on the faith. Prominent international speakers were invited to deliver talks about contemporary issues affecting the understanding of Islam as well as the universal message of Islam.

The first public forum on the topic of "Islam: Religion of Hope" was organised on 30 May with a panel of speakers including Mufti Ismail Menk, Dr Muhammad Salah, and Ridzuan Wu. The forum aimed to dispel misconceptions of Islam and highlighted examples from across the globe where Muslims and non-Muslims had co-existed peacefully and helped one another. The forum also aimed to inspire the participants to do good deeds, to reflect the true values of Islam, and to counter media stereotypes of Muslims and Islam in general.

An estimated of 10,000 people attended the public talk, public forum and In-House Talks organised by MCAS.







## ISLAM4ALL MOBILE APPLICATION





## ZAKAT DISBURSEMENT IN RAMADHAN

On 5 July, the yearly Zakat Disbursement was conducted, benefiting 552 families, each receiving \$255 in cash and \$70 in NTUC vouchers. The Guest of Honour was Heng Swee Kiat, Minister for Education. A total of \$179,400 was distributed (\$140,760 from Zakat funds and \$38,640 from Fidyah).

## RAMADHAN CHARITY BOOTH

The Ramadhan Charity Booth was a new initiative by CDD, which gave away clothes, books, toys, bags and other articles to the Ramadhan Zakat Recipients.



## RELIGIOUS TALKS FOR FAKIR MISKIN (FM) CLIENTS

There were four religious talks organised for the FM clients to encourage them in remembering their duties and responsibilities as Muslims and other subjects pertaining to Islam. A total of 82 participants took part in these talks held on 25 January, 26 April, 15 October and 29 November respectively. The speaker was Ust Hanapi Kassim.

## BUDGETING BOARD GAMES FOR FM CLIENTS

This workshop, in the form of board games, was organised with the support of South East CDC. The objective was to educate FM Clients on how to handle their finances wisely. There was participation by 9 families for the session that was conducted on 22 March.

## PROJECT REACHING OUT (PRO) – HOME VISIT

PRO, a new initiative by CDD, aimed to forge bonds with FM Clients who were Converts by visiting them at home. It was intended to let the clients know that MCAS cared and remembered them. Befrienders, mainly Converts, were hand-picked to lead the project; all befrienders underwent specialised trainings before being assigned for home visits. A total of 95 families were visited, of which 65% were Convert families. FM families were visited on 9 and 10 May, 9 June, 18 October, 15 November and 13 December.




## LEGAL CLINIC

## LEGAL CLINIC CASES




## COUNSELLING SERVICES



## CULTURAL DIVERSITY PROGRAMMES





The '35 Fun Facts About Ramadhan & Fasting' booklet was launched on 17 June, as part of the promotion of MCAS35 Open House. An ISBN was applied and approved for the booklet in hard copy and e-book versions. A total of 10,000 copies of the booklet were published for free distribution at various mosques, events, and several strategic locations throughout Singapore. By 10 July, almost all the copies have been allocated and distributed at the selected locations.



## THE MUSLIM READER MAGAZINE



The Muslim Reader (TMR), MCAS flagship magazine, provided relevant information to the new Muslims, who were in tune to learn more about their faith, and to the English-speaking members of the Muslim community. TMR was distributed to members of MCAS, as well as to the participants of selected events and programmes.

The magazines were also available for subscription and sale at the English Islamic Bookshop. In mid-2015, the frequency of the magazine was merged from three times a year to become an annual magazine. This was due to MCAS subscribing and distributing the Vizier magazine every month to MCAS members. The 2015/2016 edition of TMR, with a circulation of 5,000 copies, was scheduled for release in March 2016.

## GALAXY BEAT MAGAZINE



In conjunction with MCAS35 celebrations, the Galaxy Beat magazine for zakat payer was revived, replacing the Zakat Brochure. The magazine contained a message by the President of MCAS, six articles in both English and Malay languages, and info graphics on Zakat, such as benefits of Zakat, conditions for Zakat, Zakat calculation, and Zakat distribution. There was also a donation form and a business reply envelope included. A total of 7,000 copies of the Galaxy Beat magazine were printed. About 6,000 copies were mailed to existing Zakat payers in our database, and the remaining 1,000 copies were given to new Converts.
