

Council members, employees, volunteers, parents, students, alumni, and friends of MCAS have all found significant ways to contribute to the growth of the Association. Once again, we were able to demonstrate that unity is the foundation of our success.

MCAS continues to build meaningful ties with other organizations to help the Converts and the community at large. In September 2022, we collaborated with PPIS for a Public Talk, and this was being held physically for the first time in 2 years since the pandemic. The Public Talk was titled "The Religion that Honours Women" and received about 300 attendees. We are grateful for the achievements we've reached this year, which have allowed us to broaden our outreach to the community.

We hope to remain steadfast in helping the Converts as well as the community. In 2022, Project Ansar was launched together with our annual Official Iftar. The project aims to help and accompany Converts, including prospective Converts, on their journey towards Islam. Project Ansar intends to help the Converts for the first 2 years, post-conversion.

Our annual community service project, Qurban Drive, was held for the sixth time in 2022. The event was graced by Associate Professor Dr Muhammad Faishal Ibrahim, the Minister of State for Home Affairs and National Development. We collaborated with several Muslim organisations to reach out to about 600 disadvantaged families, providing them with groceries and Qurban meat, facilitated by about 60 cars/vans drivers. We deeply pray

that the community work we had done will touch the hearts of many and help make a difference in someone's life.

In the same event, we have also launched Give2U.sg, a donation campaign that promotes Recurring Donations. Donors are encouraged to donate especially during Fajr and on Fridays, where they can opt to donate daily, weekly or monthly. Contributions will be channelled into facilitating our outreach and educational programmes for both Converts and born Muslims alike.

Our followers on social media have steadily risen in the last year and traffic on our MCAS website has also seen an increase. We had reached out to more beneficiaries as we engage with the social services and family service centres on financial aid cases.

In summary, 2022 has been a great year with new relationships forged, deep commitments helped steer new beginnings, and the dedication of our people shined bright like a heacon

For 2023, we would like to encourage you to step forward and join us as we plan exciting activities and events for our members. EDUCATION

1 Blended Asynchronous Learning (online & independent) was adopted across MCAS courses. Opportunities for independent learning were provided alongside the prescribed lessons. Students are assigned specific tasks to complete at their own time to supplement their knowledge.



CONVERTS' CARE & SOCIAL SERVICES

- 1 One Stop Centre for Converts (OSCC): 710 conversions in 2022.
- 21 Registration Officers for conversion (RO) were appointed by MUIS in November 2022. 7 of them are first timer for the appointment.
- 3 After 2 years of absence, an Orientation & Community of Practice (COP) for the RO was also conducted physically in MCAS in November 2022.
- 4 Project Ansar soft launch was completed on 23 April 2022 during the MCAS Official Iftar 2022, officiated by the Mayor of Southeast District Mr Mohd Fahmi Aliman. Project Ansar is a pilot project which plans to help Converts with post-conversion matters.
- 5 Project Ansar High Tea was held in November 2022. Project Ansar Chairman, Bro Imran Kuna, shared at length with the volunteers about their Training Roadmap and the Converts' Support Framework which details the 2-year plan for the Convert's journey under this project.
- Women's Wing Sub-Committee was re-initiated in October 2022. The role of the Women's Wing is to foster ukhwah among MCAS women volunteers, activists and MCAS women staff. In 2022, the Women's Wing held the following activities:
 - a. Inaugural Women's Wings Power Fitness Walk November 2022
 - b. Women's Wing Talk (Collaborated with Dawah Division) With Every Difficulty Comes Ease
 December 2022
- (7) Initiated the Convert Jenazah Assistance and assisted 7 Converts jenazah.
- 8 MCAS is one of the 5 Contractors who have been awarded by Syariah Court, the Contract for the Provision of Marriage Counselling.
- 9 Reviewed the Financial Assistance (FA) 2016 policy increase the FA Per Capital Income (PCI) from \$300 to \$400.





DA'WAH

1 THE ENGLISH ISLAMIC BOOKSHOP

a. EIB Social Media Presence

In August 2021, the English Islamic Bookshop (EIB) launched an Instagram account with 124 followers to establish an online presence. The EIB followers have increased by 82% to 702.

b. EIB Open House

The EIB Open House was organised on 16 July 2022, to celebrate the official re-opening of The English Islamic Bookshop, following the renovation.

2 INTRODUCTION OF NEW MODULES

a. Da'wah Awareness Training Program (DATP) 2022 was conducted in hybrid setting with a total of 24 participants. Two of the most significant features were the incorporation of Awareness Through Mosque Tour (ATMT) and Online Da'wah.

3 ISLAMIC LEARNING TALKS

a. The Fellow Asatizah Network was formed to support the increase in Da'wah Outreach and the pressing need for religious inputs. They will be providing religious consultations, engaging in the vetting of and ensuring the suitability of our free publications and books sold at the EIB.

4 CITY CORNER PROJECT

- a. In the span of a year, the City Corner project have significantly increased its partners from 18 to 45 in 2022.
- b. A new initiative was launched in October 2022 to consolidate City Corner's QR codes into a single point of access to relevant Da'wah and other resources such as Knowing Islam Session, Free Publication and Give MCAS donation page. As of December 2022, there are 420 visits via the new QR code.

4 ZAKAT and DONATIONS

- a. Expanded the online donation platform: Give2U.sg
- b. Collaborated with NJU Five Pillars on a Podcast advertisement campaign. The Podcast aired a four-week campaign consisting of three episodes per week from 11 March to 1 April 2022. Each week, there were an average of 102,295 streams and 52,452 listeners.
- c. Collected a record \$5.157M in Zakat in 2022 (Syawal 1442H to Ramadan 1443H)
- d. Launched fundraising campaign: the Fajr (Morning) Donation Campaign and the Friday Donation Campaign on 31 July 2022. Raised \$16,068 for the campaign in 2022.
- e. Strategized the fundraising activities for MCAS Mini Ramadan Bazaar for 2023.

5 PROJECT UPDATES

a. ISO 22301: 2019 Business Continuity Management Systems Consultancy

In 2022, successfully completed System Development Parts 1 and 2, the completion of the Management Manual and Management Procedures, and System Implementation Training. System audit assurance is anticipated in July and September of 2023.

WHISTLEBLOWING POLICY

Whistleblowing refers to a voluntary and deliberate disclosure by an employee or volunteer who has direct dealings with MCAS, to a party appointed by MCAS, of any malpractice, illegal, or unlawful conduct or wilful commissions at work, or potential irregularities in procedures within.

To encourage MCAS employees and volunteers to report their concerns about any reasonable belief of wrongdoing, misconduct, and breach of policies, laws, or regulation that they witness or suspect to be occurring within the Association, so that these concerns can be addressed accordingly, they can report the matter through the five channels below to the Ethical Hotline, managed by Shared Services for Charities Limited (SSC), a party appointed by MCAS.




- a. Renewed the lease tenancy (1 December 2022 to 30 November 2023) for Hexacube, #04-07 Muslim Counselling Service.








At the AGM the Minutes of the AGM held on 4 April 2021, the Annual Report for year ending 31 December 2021 and the Management and Financial Statements for year ending 31 December 2021, were adopted as proposed.

There had been 39 nominees vying for the position of Council members for the term 2022-2024. Only 27 were elected at the AGM. The elected Council members consist of 15 Converts and 12 Born Muslims in accordance with the Constitution which requires the majority of the Council to be Converts (Clause 6(a)(v)).

EXTRAORDINARY GENERAL MEETING (EOGM)

The Association held an Extraordinary General Meeting (EOGM) on 2 April 2022, from 3.00 pm – 5.00 pm, at Lifelong Learning Institute. The EOGM was held arising from the written petitions received from 28 Members on 9 March 2022. The petitioners did not submit a petition. They submitted the following motions as the proposed Agenda for the EOGM:

- 1. Motion to revoke the suspension and reinstate brother A. Muralitharan @ Muhammad Yusuf Ali's ordinary membership.
- 2. Motion to rescind and subsequently affirm rejected AGM 2022 nominations arising from brother Muhammad Ali's suspension of membership.
- 3. Motion to affirm brother A. Muralitharan @ Muhammad Yusuf Ali's AGM 2022 nomination.

The EOGM was chaired by Bro Abdul Rahman BMH, member of the Legal Sub-Committee. At the Meeting, the petitioners presented their case. Subsequently, Bro Ariff Sultan, VP (CA) replied on behalf of the Management Council to explain the rationale for the decision to suspend the Member's ordinary membership. The EOGM did not vote on any of the 3 motions.

COUNCIL ORIENTATION AND INDUCTION TRAINING

The newly elected Council Members attended an Orientation and Induction Training on 13 August 2022. For the Council Orientation, the session was conducted by Bro Ariff Sultan, VP (CA). The Induction Training was conducted by Dr Ameen Talib.

The Annual General Meeting (AGM) for MCST 1677 (Galaxy) was held at The Galaxy Tower Void Deck on 5 November 2022 at 10 am. The Trustees had given their proxies and approval to the Association's representative, Bro Mohd Yusof Phone and (Council) and Bro Razali Tompang (Staff).

At the AGM, Bro Razali was voted to be the Chairman for MCST 1677 while Bro Mohd Yusof Phone was voted as a Council member 2022-2023.

The AGM for MCST 4563 (Hexacube) was held on 22 July 2022, and the Association was represented by Bro Razali who was subsequently appointed as a Chairman of the MCST. Bro Kelvin Lee, a Council Member, was appointed as the Secretary.

CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY




Convert Jenazah Assistance Programme

Convert Jenazah Assistance was a new initiative steered by the CCSS division that was fully implemented in July 2022. Taking lead was the VP of CCSS, Bro Mikhail Kheng and HOD, Bro Junaidi Ali with staff to assist Converts who had passed on. We had several Converts who had passed on without Muslim family members. The non-Muslim family members confused on how to deal with the passing of their loved ones.

CCSS then steps in to assist with the Islamic burial rites as well as provide moral support for the existing family members. During the cleansing, shrouding and burial of their loved ones, non-Muslim family members are encouraged to join in the Islamic rites giving them a hands-on experience as well as insight into how the burial will be conducted.

CCSS will engage a Jenazah company to perform the Islamic burial rites and the CCSS team including MCAS volunteers will be there to offer assistance and support.

We conducted jenazah services for 7 Converts. CCSS also gives some monetary assistance of \$500/300 to convert's family members to support their household during this interim period.



The Heart of The Quran Surah Yasin (Guided Recitation) zoom sessions were put on hold for a few months but restarted in September 2022 and are held every last Thursday of the month. These sessions are conducted by Ustaz Muhammad Faisal Mohamed Ayub who led the participants in the recitation of Surah Yasin and gave a short tazkirah post-recitation.

Orientation and Community of Practice (COP) for Registrar of Conversion Officer (RO)

The session's objective is to allow registrars to share experiences, exchange ideas, further process emerging issues and improve their duties as ROs. This allowed learning in a team through sharing of tips, stories, and best practices. The session was conducted on 24 November 2022 at MCAS. There were 9 ROs attended the session which was conducted from 8 p.m. to 10 p.m. There was a follow up session for newly appointed ROs in December 2022.

Guided by The Learning Pathway introduced in 2015, the Education Division (ED) offers a clear and progressive learning opportunity to all students, primarily the Converts. The pathway aspires to provide students the ability to chart their own progress in learning about the religion and participate in the courses according to their level of knowledge.

To ensure that lessons remain relevant with the current trends, ED has undertaken significant steps to review and restructure all lessons' content. Marketing initiatives such as posters and course information booklet have also been made available for mass dissemination, both in physical and electronic forms.

In 2020, The Learning Pathway was enhanced further to provide a more streamlined approach to learning by offering students better opportunity to access the different range of subjects offered at MCAS.



HIGHLIGHTS OF MCAS FLAGSHIP PROGRAMMES

Guided by the restrictions and guidelines by the relevant authorities overseeing the development of COVID-19 pandemic, classes are offered in physical, online and hybrid formats. As MCAS embraces the new norm for post-COVID-19 period following more easing of COVID-19 restriction, we decided on the journey to continue diversifying our mode of delivery for our flagship programmes. Continuation of online courses and resumption of physical courses have given the opportunities for locals as well as those who are abroad to learn Islam at MCAS. The classes are as follow:



Knowing Islam Session (KIS)

This session aims to introduce Islam with the correct principles and understanding. The class also addresses the foundation of Islamic faith, the concept of God and the holy prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him).

DA'WAH AWARENESS TRAINING PROGRAMME (DATP)

Da'wah Awareness Training Programme (DATP) has reached its 4th run in 2022 after a 2-year hiatus, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. 
YODA Circle sessions



A sum of \$120,000 of zakat and \$48,000 of fidyah were distributed to 600 beneficiaries, during the event.






SYARIAH COURT CASES & WALK-IN COUNSELLING CASES



MNC GATHERING, SEMBAWANG MOSQUE VISIT



In the same light, Project Ansar aims to help the new Muslims on their journey in embracing Islam, accompanying them at the start their path.

This is the first time any association in Singapore has ever done a project as large as this to help converts with their journey after their conversion. The project is slated to officially begin in January 2023.

The set is sold at only \$10. Buyers can get a 20% discount for purchases of 25 calendars and more.






EDM & NEWSLETTER


