

CORPORATE AFFAIRS



1. THE MCAS EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK

This year, the MCAS Employee Handbook underwent a comprehensive review to maintain relevance and accuracy, following revisions last made in 2021.



2. CCTV INSTALLATION

The CCTV project in MCAS has achieved a major milestone with the successful completion of the installation and testing phase.

3. IT UPDATES

a. Bursary Online Application

Developed and implemented an online submission platform for bursary applications, enhancing the convenience for applicants to electronically submit their requests along with supporting documents.


b. Smart TV

Effectively upgraded all classroom projectors to 85-inch smart TVs.

c. Server Co-location

Deployed and installed multiple servers at the nearby regional data center, in line with the ISO 22301:2019 Business Continuity Planning (BCP) standards and the MCAS IT Policy.

CONVERTS' CARE AND SOCIAL SERVICES



1. ONE-STOP CENTRE FOR CONVERTS (OSCC)

CCSS achieved a record-breaking conversion rate by officially completing 862 conversions.

2. CONVERTS' CARE

a. CCSS assisted 12 converts and families who have passed on through the Convert Jenazah Assistance Programme.

b. The Japanese and Vietnamese Multi-National Clubs were formally established, holding their inaugural gatherings at the MCAS premises.

c. 14 women volunteers were awarded for their contributions to help our converts and the community at large at the MCAS Women's Appreciation Award Ceremony, graced by the 8th President of the Republic of Singapore, Madam Halimah Yacob.

d. 40 Project Ansar Befrienders received certificates at the MCAS Official Iftar 2023.

e. Inaugural Life After Death programme - The Final Departure received a positive response with the attendance of 177 participants.

f. Kickstarted the translation project for Muslim Converts' Guidebook - Understanding the Singapore Muslim Community into Vietnamese and Burmese languages.

3. SOCIAL SERVICES

a. CCSS received a total of 686 referral court cases for marriage counselling from Syariah Court (SYC), marking the highest numbers recorded.

b. CCSS conducted 17 house and hospital visits to facilitate zakat financial aid applications and assess the well-being of home/hospital-bound beneficiaries.

DA'WAH



1. THE ENGLISH ISLAMIC BOOKSHOP (EIB)

a. Social Media Presence

The English Islamic Bookshop followers has increased by 61% in 2023 from the year 2022, with 1,161 followers.

b. Little Muslims Corner (LMC)

The 'Little Muslims Corner' debuted at the Public Talks. LMC provided engaging activities like storytelling and arts as parents attended the talks.

2. INITIATED POST-TALK INTERVIEWS

Da'wah Division initiated post-talk interviews with participants to gain insights on the benefits garnered as well as valuable feedbacks. This contributed to the overall success and effectiveness of the talks by facilitating evaluation, improvement, and participant engagement.

EDUCATION



1. Collaboration with Da’wah Division on Teachers’ Training and Communities of Practice entitled The Preppers Workshop – Asatizah Edition.
2. Recommending FIRST and FIQS certificate programmes after reviewing and enhancing the curriculum. Added 2 new modules to provide a holistic curriculum prior to their progression for Advance Certificate Programme.

FINANCE



1. ENHANCED SOPs (Standard Operating Procedures)

- a. Updated SOP to optimize excess Zakat utilization.
- b. Enhanced SOP for payment methods.
- c. Revised SOP for property, plant, and equipment useful life from 10 to 5 years.
- d. Revised SOP for refreshment rates.

2. ZAKAT AND DONATIONS

- a. Collected a record \$5.839 million of Zakat (from Syawal 1443H to Ramadan 1444H).
- b. Fajr donations totaled \$32,216 while Friday donations reached \$29,271.
- c. Collaborated with NJU Pte Ltd with a four-week podcast advertisement campaign between 3 and 24 February 2023, airing three episodes per week. There was a total of 504,898 streams and 213,222 listeners.
- d. Created short Zakat videos and shared across Facebook, Instagram, and TikTok, accumulating a total of 14,411 views.
- e. Collaborated with IT to implement Queue Mobile System at the Zakat Collection Centre during Ramadan.
- f. The Ramadan Project Team 2024 was formed on 20 May 2023 to effectively coordinate all activities and initiatives for the Ramadan 2024 program. This facilitates a thematic approach in the planning process, with the overarching theme for Ramadan 2024 being “Sharing Blessings.”

3. FUNDRAISING INITIATIVES

- a. Mini booths at Dr. Baptiste Brodard’s Journey of Faith Talk (22-24 June 2023).



- b. Created and sold enamel pins to support Qurban Drive 2023.
- c. Collaborated with Wash Pit Pte Ltd for Fund Carwash Day (16-17 September 2023).

4. MCAS RESERVES

Reserves Policy

The MCAS Reserves exceeded the minimum threshold of 3 years' worth of current operating expenses at the end of 2023.

5. PROJECT UPDATES

a. ISO 22301: 2019 Business Continuity Management Systems Consultancy

SOCOTEC Certification Singapore Pte Ltd conducted a Stage 1 audit on 25 October 2023, followed by a Stage 2 audit on 9 and 10 November 2023, focusing on evaluating the effectiveness of our management system. After a thorough assessment, the audit team recommended awarding the certification on 7 December 2023.

b. Document Management System (DMS)

On 19 March 2023, the Council approved the DMS initiative. The DMS aims to efficiently capture, track, and store softcopy documents, streamlining the filing process into designated folders. This automation enhances workflow efficiency and significantly reduces content errors.

Secured a \$40,000 grant from National Council of Social Service (NCSS) for the Charities Capability Fund (CCF) Info-Communications Technology (ICT) Grant on 8 November 2023, paving the way for project implementation starting in March 2024.

c. Donation Management System

On 23 September 2023, the Council approved the Donation Management System initiative. The Donation Management System integrates a comprehensive platform with a donor database, facilitating donation tracking, communication streamlining, and improved donor relationship management.

This system provides a holistic view of donor information, fostering effective collaboration, transparency, and enhanced reporting capabilities.

A Service Level Agreement was formally established between GivePlease Pte Ltd and MCAS on 1 October 2023, encompassing a suite of digital platforms, including the Donation Management System, eDonation Website & Content Management System Platform, and Dynamic Payment Engine, built on cutting-edge infrastructure for reliability and scalability. The project is scheduled for implementation in March 2024.





WHISTLEBLOWING POLICY

Whistleblowing refers to a voluntary and deliberate disclosure by an employee or volunteer who has direct dealings with MCAS, to a party appointed by MCAS, of any malpractice, illegal, or unlawful conduct or wilful commissions at work, or potential irregularities in procedures within.

To encourage MCAS employees and volunteers to report their concerns about any reasonable belief of wrongdoing, misconduct, and breach of policies, laws, or regulation that they witness or suspect to be occurring within the Association, so that these concerns can be addressed accordingly, they can report the matter through the five channels, to the Ethical Hotline, managed by Shared Services for Charities Limited (SSC), a party appointed by MCAS.

INVESTMENT PORTFOLIO

INVESTMENT INCOME AND PORTFOLIO VALUE

Total Investment Income:

Our 2023 gross investment income reached \$1,414,665 marking a 39.70% increase from \$1,012,656 in 2022.

Portfolio Value:

The total value of our investment portfolio surged to \$45,667,299 in 2023, showcasing a 5.60% rise from \$43,245,900 in 2022.



ISLAMIC TERM DEPOSITS

Dividends:

Our dividend income soared to \$464,587 in 2023, marking a remarkable 253.47% increase from \$131,436 in 2022.

Engagement with Qatar National Bank (QNB) and QNB Asset Management

The Council approved a banking, investment, and asset management relationship with Qatar National Bank (QNB) and QNB Asset Management. The Investment Management Agreement between MCAS and QNB was signed on 9 December 2023.



PROPERTY INVESTMENTS

Rental Income:

Achieved a total gross rent of \$430,499 from our investment properties located at Suntec and Hexacube. An increase of 3.56% as compared to last year, 2022, which earned a total of \$415,704.

Lease Renewals:

Suntec Renewals

Singapore Italian Trade Commission, #19-01A: Renewed the lease for 3 years, effective from 1 March 2024 to 28 February 2027.

Singapore Carbon Hydrogen Energy Pte Ltd, #19-01B: Renewed the lease for 2 years, commencing from 1 August 2023 to 31 July 2025.

Hexacube Renewals

Muslim Counselling Service, #04-07: Renewed the lease for 1 year, starting from 1 December 2023 to 30 November 2024.

Altruistic Interior Pte Ltd, #04-08: Extended the lease for 2 years, effective from 1 August 2023 to 31 July 2025.



**SUKUK INVESTMENT
(MAYBANK GLOBAL SUKUK INCOME (ISLAMIC) FUND)**

Earned \$427,601 in dividends from Sukuk investment in 2023 on a \$10,873,000 investment (at cost). Similarly, income earned in 2022 was \$427,601.



ISO 22301:2019 BUSINESS CONTINUITY MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS

The Muslim Converts' Association of Singapore (MCAS) is ISO 22301:2019 Business Continuity Management Systems certified.

The Association has been accredited with the ISO 22301:2019 certification. Attaining the certification required rigorous assessment of the international standard for business continuity management systems (BCMS), facilitating business functions in the event of an emergency.

The Association's BCMS aims to ensure zero disruptions, minimize business operation impacts during emergencies, and prevent any data loss affecting business operations. Additionally, contingency and recovery plans have been established for addressing potential causes of business disruptions.

MCAS was audited (Stage 1) by SOCOTEC Certification Singapore Pte Ltd on 25 October 2023, followed by Stage 2 audit held on 9 and 10 November 2023.

The Association was also evaluated thoroughly in assessment procedures such as BCMS development and implementation, management system documentation review, and more, to become ISO 22301:2019 certified. MCAS obtained the ISO certification on 7 December 2023, following a successful audit and assessment with zero major discrepancies discovered.

MCAS held its 43rd Annual General Meeting (AGM) on 19 March 2023.


Fiqh for Ladies






Fiqh for Travellers


1a. The Ramadan Series A Collaboration by EIB and YODA

1b. The Eid Series by EIB, YODA and DATP




YODA Circle Sessions


4.3 Expo Booth

4. Legal Clinic





A total of 686 cases were referred by Syariah Court to MCAS between the months of January and December 2023, of which 337 cases were closed, 57 Absent, 25 Reconciled, 59 Withdrawn without Attendance and 183 cases left for follow-up/yet to meet. A total of 50 walk-in counselling cases were attended between the months of January and December 2023.

6. Convert Jenazah Assistance Programme

The Convert Jenazah Assistance initiative, led by the CCSS Division and fully implemented in July 2022, continued to support Converts who passed away in 2023, particularly those without Muslim family members. Non-Muslim family members often faced confusion in handling the passing of their loved ones. CCSS provided aid, including support for Islamic burial rites and moral assistance.

The Division engaged Jenazah management companies for these families to facilitate Islamic burial rites. MCAS volunteers from Project Ansar and CCSS employees supported Converts and their families, offering financial and emotional assistance throughout the burial process. Non-Muslim family members were encouraged to participate in the Islamic rites during the cleansing, shrouding, and burial, providing them with a hands-on experience and insight into the Islamic burial process.

Multi-National Clubs

MCAS fosters unity among individuals of diverse backgrounds through its Multi-National Clubs (MNCs). Communication primarily occurs through Telegram groups, where new Converts from respective nationalities/races are encouraged to join after their conversion ceremonies. MCAS appoints a coordinator for each MNC to facilitate information dissemination about MCAS’ events.

Monthly discussions and activities are organized, creating opportunities for Converts and non-Muslims from various ethnicities to connect with new Converts from their community. Facilitated by speakers, volunteers, and asatizah, these events often take place on Sundays.



Ustaz Akmal from Pusara Aman Mosque, guided the participants on the prayer area for the jenazah at the mosque. Ustaz Abdul Mateen Abu Bakar explained further on rulings, general guidelines and etiquettes, and local customs and cultures, which are matters relevant to the participants, many of whom are Converts.


MCAS Women’s Appreciation Award Ceremony 2023

Monthly Surah Yaseen (Guided Recitation & Sharing)





Ramadan Pre-Iftar Zoom Sharing Sessions




