This year, our Qurban meat distribution took on a special meaning with the inaugural Gift of Qurban Lunch & Distribution, where a heartwarming feast was shared with our valued beneficiaries and esteemed guests. In collaboration with Hezom International and Al-Falah Academy Singapore, we were blessed to distribute a generous 2,000kg of Qurban meat portions, sharing the Gift of Qurban with 700 families.

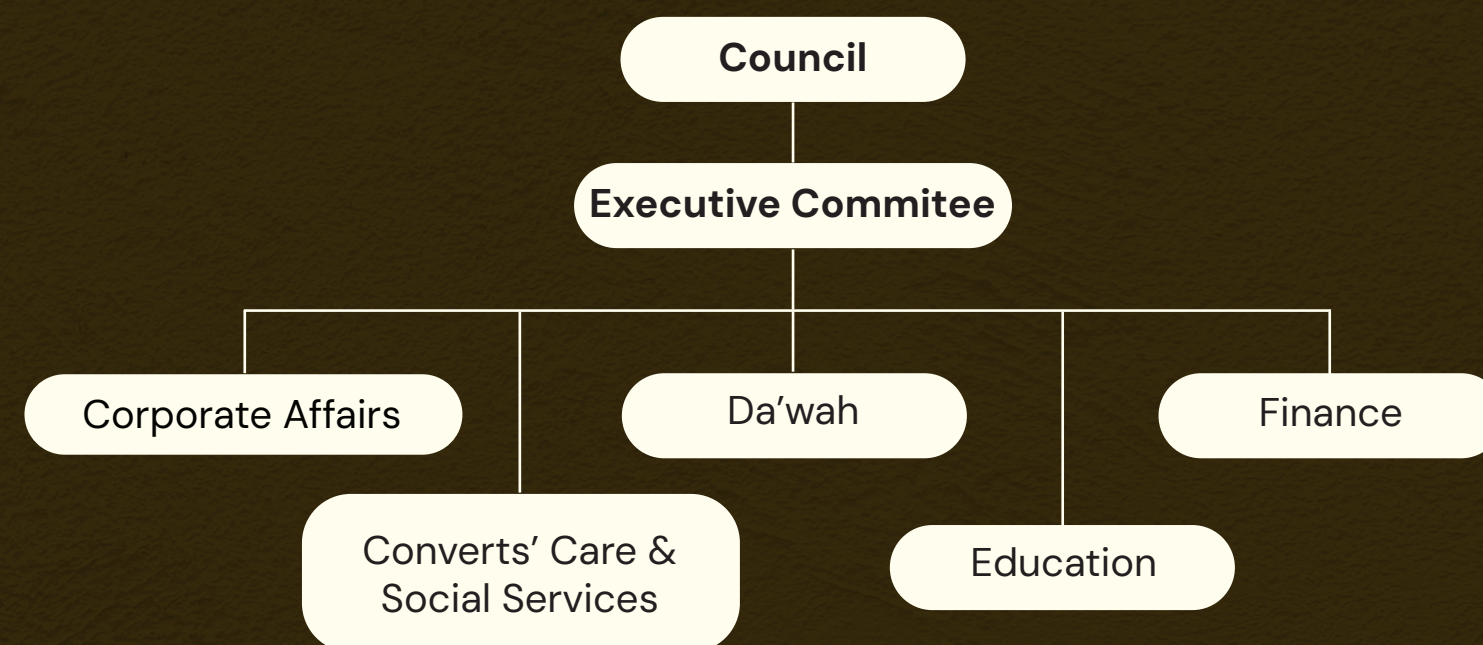

Total Investment Income:

Our 2024 gross investment income reached **\$1,539,127** marking a **8.79%** increase from \$1,414,665 in 2023.

Portfolio Value:

The total value of our investment portfolio *surged to \$47,469,906 in 2024*, showcasing a **3.95%** rise from \$45,667,299 in 2023.

Our dividend income rose to **\$552,085 in 2024**, marking a remarkable **18.83%** increase from \$464,587 in 2023.

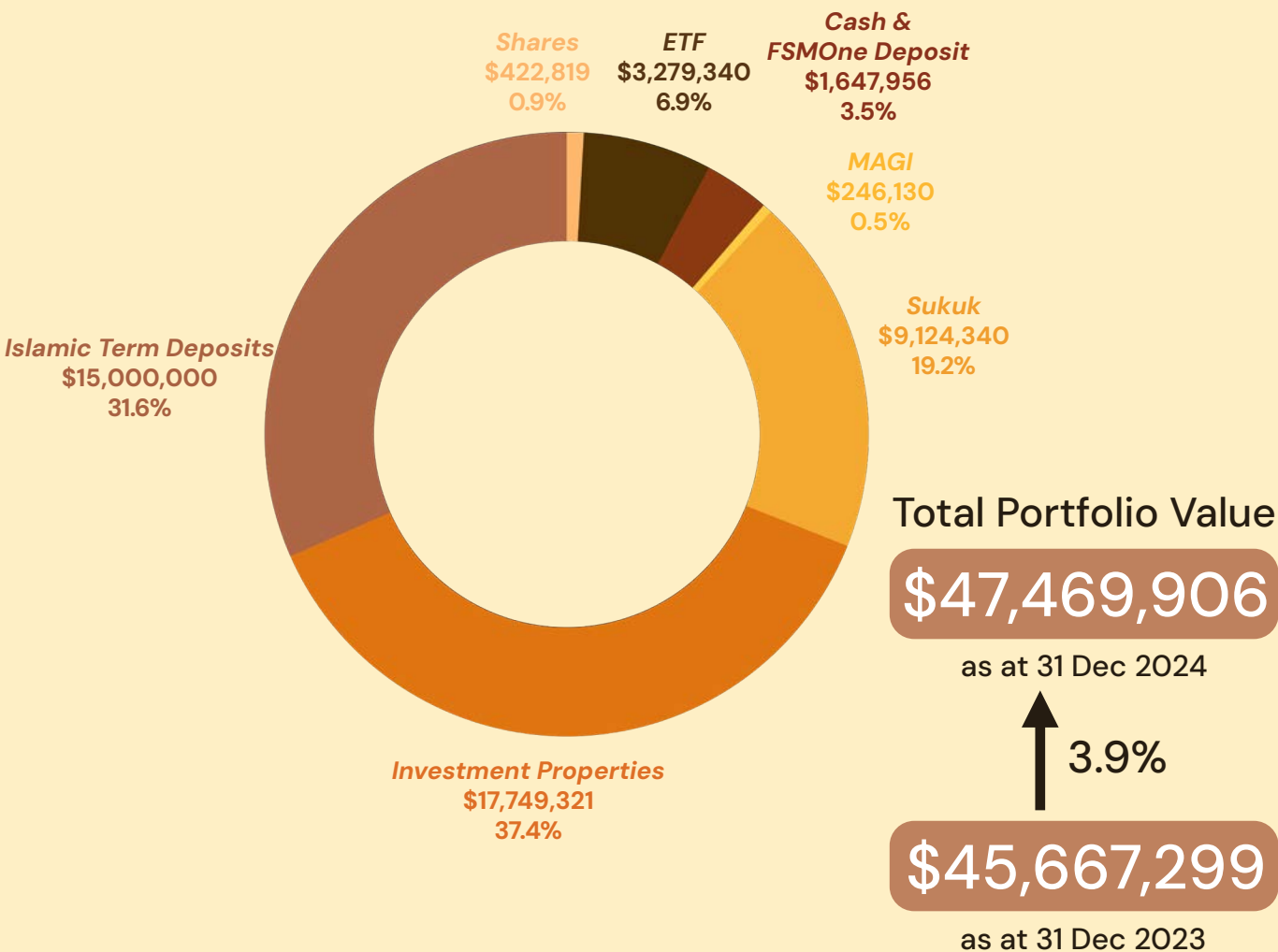

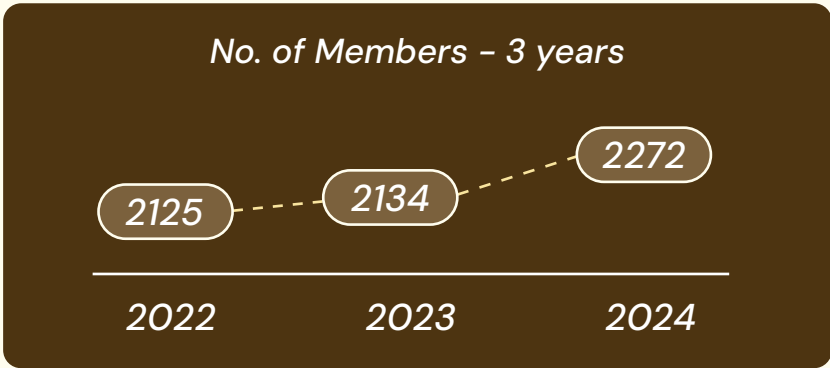
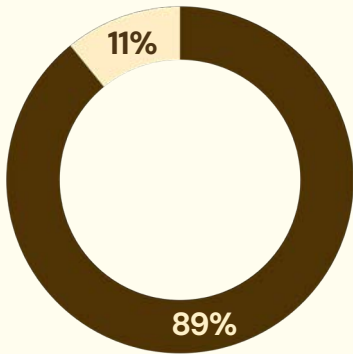

At MCST 1677's AGM on 13 September 2024, Bro Razali was reappointed as Secretary, while Bro Muhammad Haziq Roslan (MCAS employee) is appointed as Council Member.

44th Annual General Meeting

MCAS held its 44th Annual General Meeting (AGM) on 17 March 2024. The Minutes of the 43rd AGM held on 19 March 2023, the Annual Report for year ending 31 December 2023 and the Management and Financial Statements for year ending 31 December 2023, were adopted as proposed.

There had been 24 nominees vying for the position of Council members for the term

2024-2026. Only 23 were elected at the AGM. The elected Council members consisted of 12 Converts and 11 Born Muslims in accordance with the Constitution which requires the majority of the Council to be Converts (Clause 6(a)(v)).

Proposed Constitutional Amendments were not carried out due to a lack of quorum at the AGM.

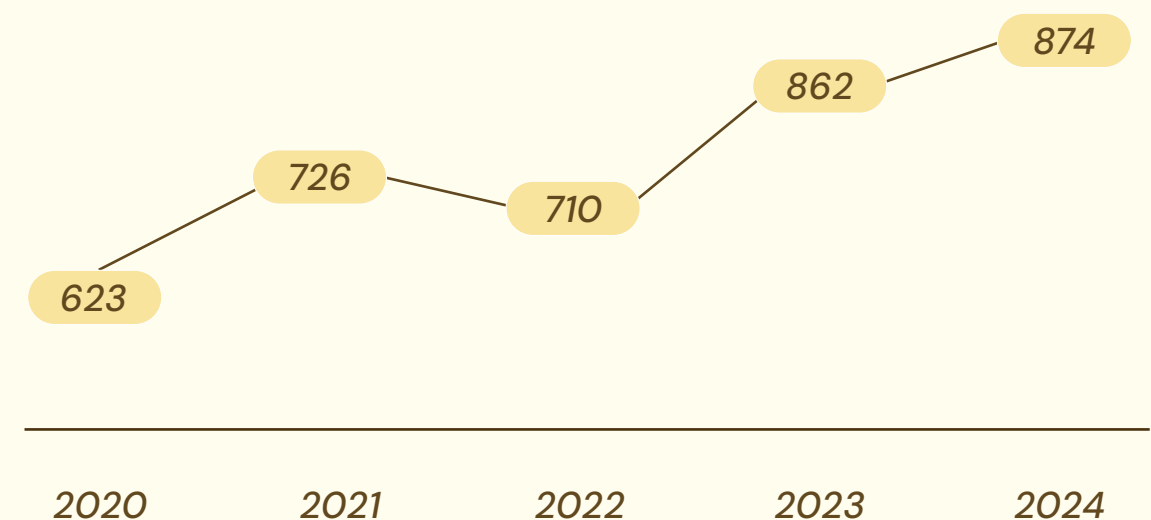
One Stop Centre for Converts (OSCC)

Advanced

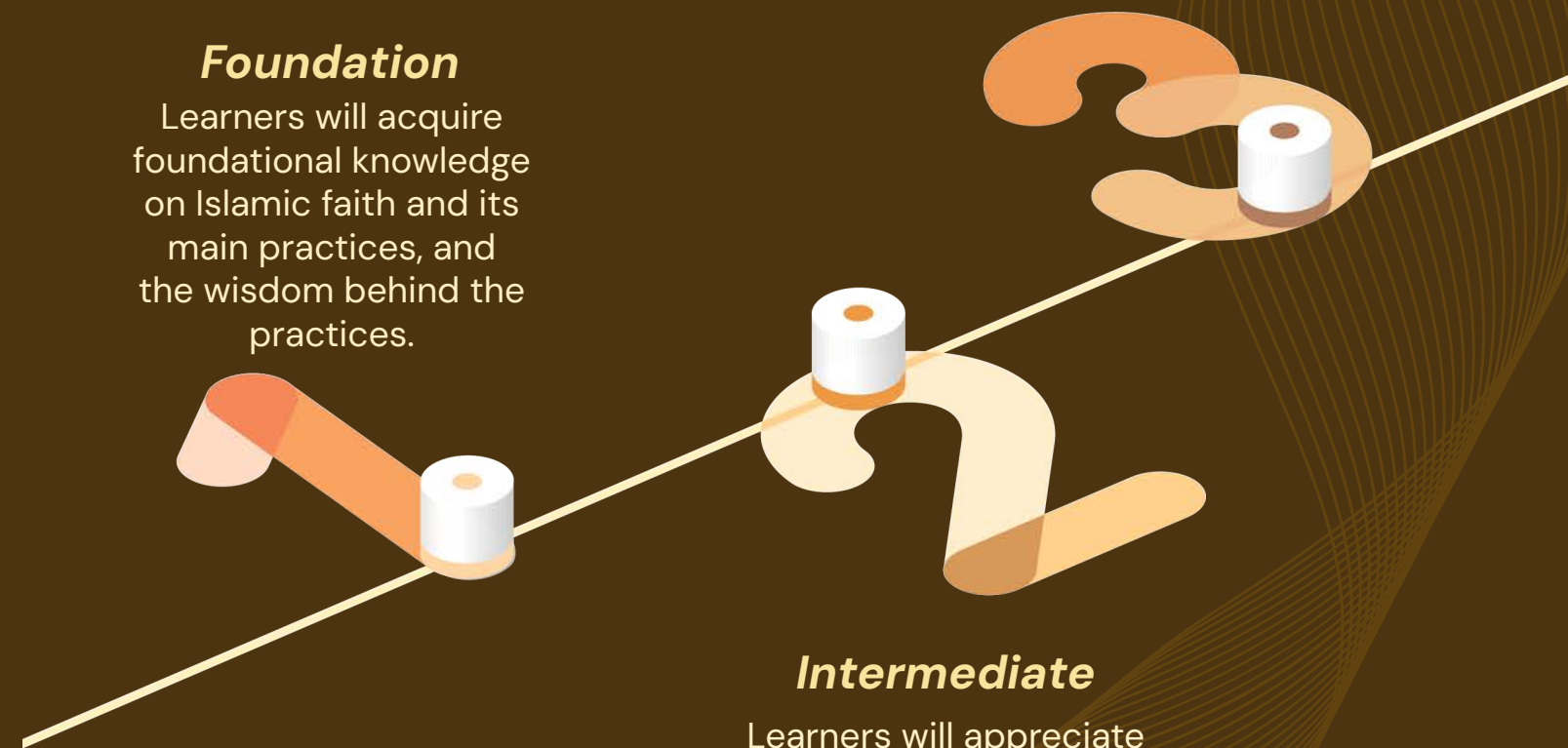
Learners will develop analytical understanding of Islam through long term course, as well as appreciate the knowledge seeking tradition of the scholars (Ulama).

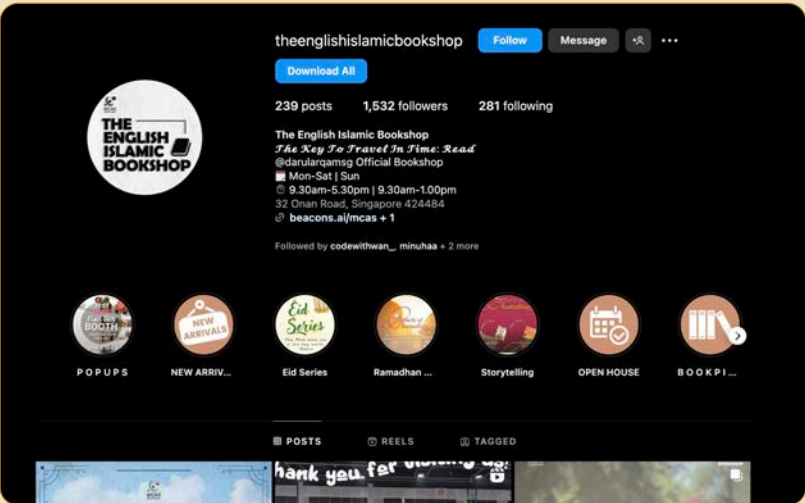
DA’WAH ACTIVITIES

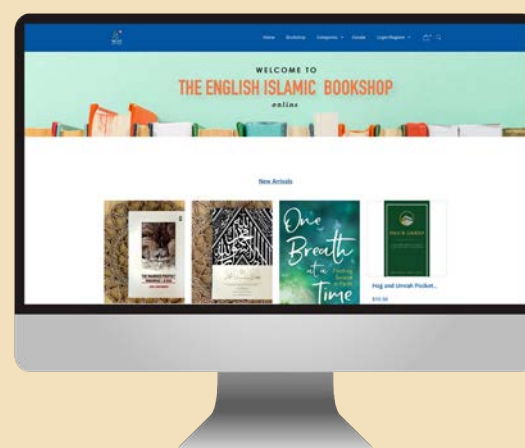
Walking Trail: Led by HDG docents, participants explored Telok Ayer's diverse places of worship, reinforcing interfaith respect.

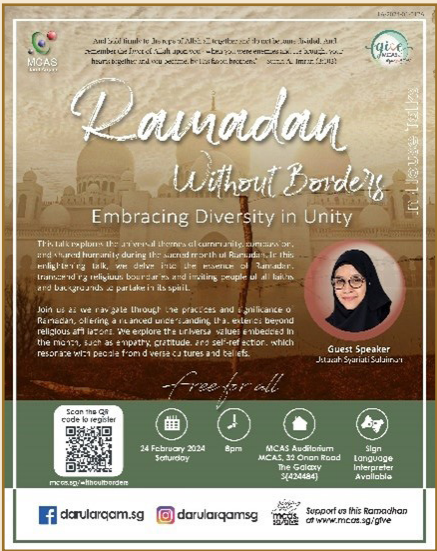

3 Pathfinder Youth Camp

YODA and MAHKP (Masjid Abdul Hamid Kampung Pasiran) Youth Club hosted the Pathfinders: Muslim Journey Youth Camp on 29–30 June, guiding 35 youth in self-discovery, growth, and leadership, rooted in spiritual values and prophetic wisdom.



Key Activities

Leadership & Responsibility in the "Who Am I" Challenge introduces the spiritual journey of a Muslim youth, highlighting personal struggles in becoming better Muslims. Participants will engage in reflective exercises and discussions to gain insight into their challenges.

The Night Walk, Spiritual Session, and Interactive Discussions focus on the struggles of the prophets, offering lessons for personal growth. Asatizah will share prophetic stories and their challenges, followed by guided reflections among participants.

4 Hands for Hope: Youth at Work, Hearts in Service

"Hands for Hope: Youth at Work, Hearts in Service" brings youth volunteers together to support the community through acts of service, such as home cleaning and helping Converts and underserved families, fostering empathy, responsibility, and positive impact.



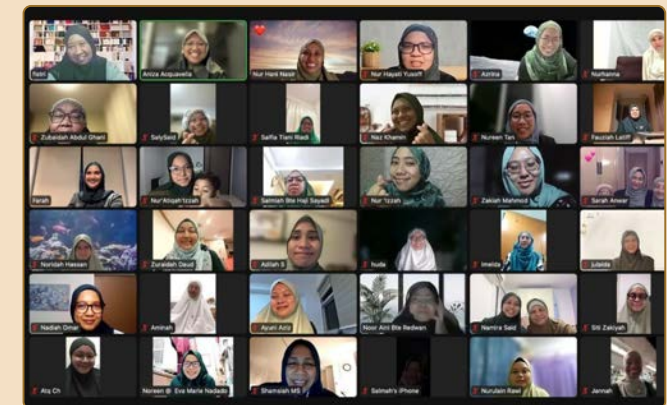
5 Youth Get-Together Event

The annual YODA Youth Get-Together featured a terrarium-making workshop to foster creativity and connection. A presentation highlighted YODA's mission, values, and 2024 achievements, inspiring attendees and encouraging volunteer involvement for 2025, strengthening commitment among new and returning members.



6 Ramadan Tadarus

This 24-day Ramadan program offered online sessions for men (30 participants) and women (150 participants), along with a Khatam Quran session led by Ustaz Amir, promoting spiritual growth and the benefits of Quran recitation during Ramadan.



SOCIAL SUPPORT & WELFARE SERVICES

Project SEED

The Association launched Project SEED, an initiative dedicated to supporting local Madrasahs and organisations in early Islamic and Madrasah education. Launched during MCAS' Official Iftar 2024 on 30 March, Project SEED distributed \$10,000 cheques to the 11 selected Malay Muslim Organisations (MMOs)/Madrasahs.



Ramadan Zakat Disbursement 2024

The annual Zakat Ramadan Disbursement on 31 March, supported 500 families, each receiving \$300 in cash, \$120 in NTUC vouchers, and 1kg of mutton meat, sponsored by 7 Sails Trading Pte Ltd. A total of \$210,000 was disbursed, including \$150,000 from Zakat and \$60,000 from Fidyah.



Gift of Qurban Lunch & Distribution 2024

On 7 July, MCAS launched its inaugural Gift of Qurban Lunch & Distribution, supported by Hezom International and Al-Falah Academy Singapore. 700 families received 2,000kg of Qurban meat.

This unique initiative, featuring a communal feast, fostered giving, sharing, and gratitude. The occasion was graced by Mr. Mohd Fahmi Aliman, Mayor of South East District.



Education Grant Award Ceremony 2024

On 7 December, MCAS awarded \$202,500 in Education Grants to 82 students, including \$67,500 for 45 Madrasah students and \$135,000 for 37 tertiary students. Notably, this was the first time Madrasah students received grants under Project SEED.

Project Ansar Home Visits

On 20 October, Project Ansar and YODA volunteers cleaned 6 homes of elderly and ill Financial Assistance recipients as part of the Hands4Hope project. A total of 62 volunteers visited 24 homes, providing \$50 NTUC vouchers, and checking on residents' well-being.



Legal Clinic

Legal Clinic sessions are conducted free-of-charge, by MCAS volunteer lawyers. The service is provided for MCAS members and the public. 35 cases were handled by the legal clinic in 2024.

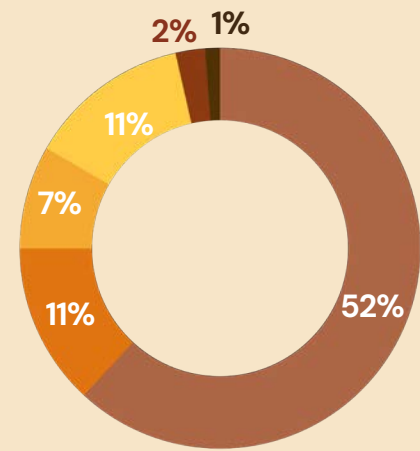

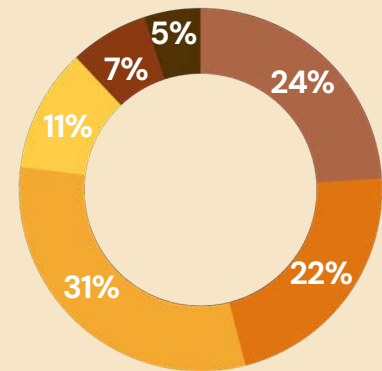

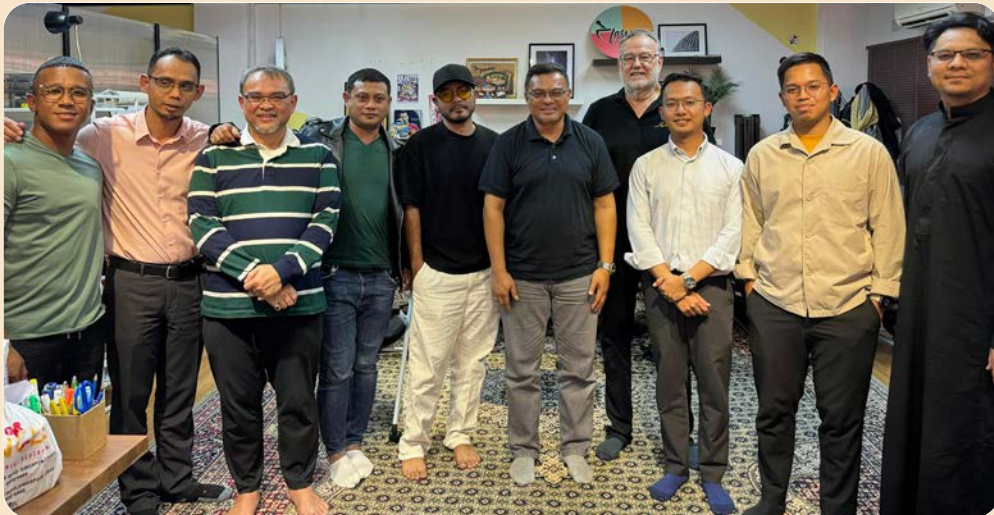


Azan Workshop

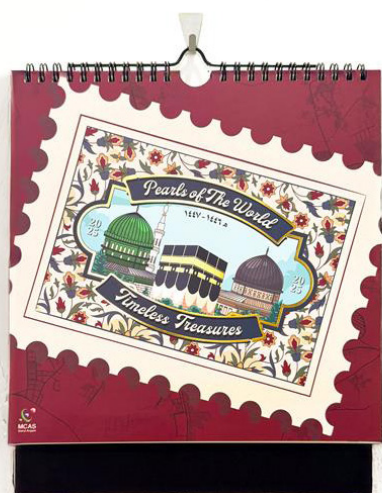
