Participants enjoyed cultural activities, traditional games, and food-tasting booths, creating bonds that transcend differences and strengthen our shared identity.

We also continued to uplift women through dedicated programmes for our Muslimah volunteers, including organising an all-Muslimah talk in October 2025, titled "Beyond the

In November, we had the honour of hosting the inaugural Asia Pacific Cross-Cultural Convert Conference (APCCCC) 2025, welcoming 110 delegates from 14 countries across the region. The conference produced three resolutions aimed at strengthening convert support globally, with implementation targeted by 2027.

Our 45th Anniversary Gala Dinner was a heartfelt tribute to our rich heritage and enduring mission. It was an evening

of inspiring stories, gratitude, and unity and a testament to the collective spirit that has shaped MCAS Darul Arqam Singapore over the decades.

Key Divisional Milestones 2025



Business & Social Services

The English Islamic Bookshop expanded its community reach, **achieving 17.8% follower growth**, hosting 6 events, and strengthening partnerships through collaborative community engagements.

Disbursed **\$460,504 in financial assistance to support 168 clients** across multiple aid schemes, reinforcing its commitment to social upliftment and care.

The Counselling Unit delivered end-to-end management of 857 Syariah Court cases, achieving **709 case closures and \$221,950 in accurate billings**, while also conducting 2 preventive community workshops addressing family and domestic challenges.

Organised **women's only dialogue session and a bonding trip**.

Panel Representatives for **creation of Ministry of Social and Family Development - Family Service Centre Code of Practise for Counsellors in Singapore**.

Sustained its role as the **One-Stop Centre for Converts (OSCC)** in Singapore, facilitating **702 conversions** in 2025 and strengthening governance through the appointment of **21 MUIS-appointed Registrars of Conversion** for the 2025–2027 term.

Corporate Affairs

Launched Branches of Hope, a festive Ramadan gifting initiative that **fulfilled the wishes of 110 children from Convert families**, in collaboration with 5 partner organisations, bringing joy and inclusion to vulnerable households.

Successfully rebranded its website and social media platforms in conjunction with its 45th Anniversary, integrating key services and contact points while achieving increased outreach, higher engagement across wider age groups, and improved advertising traffic.

Completed the renovation and expansion of its office spaces, upgrading work environments, implementing hot-desking, and ensuring adequate facilities to support current staffing needs, future growth, and efficient operations.

Constitutional amendments approved by Members, at the AGM on 15 March 2025 and endorsed by the ROS/COC on 24 June 2025, revised the Council size limit to 17 members.

At the Extraordinary General Meeting (EOGM) on 31 August 2025, **members approved extending the current Council's term until the 2026 election** to ensure continuity of governance.



Da'wah & Converts' Care

MCAS successfully organised its **first MCAS-led Umrah programme**, conducted fully in English. The 12-day spiritual journey across Makkah and Madinah involved **81 pilgrims, including 31 fully sponsored Golden Ticket holders, with 45 participants being Converts**.

Launched the Qur'an & Qasidah programme, providing a platform for spiritual reflection and devotion, reaching its **highest attendance of 50 participants in June, with approximately 50% Converts**.

Launched Calm to Qiyam during the last 10 nights of Ramadan, engaging participants across multiple mosques with strong Convert participation and facilitation support from Youth of Darul Arqam (YODA) members.

Revitalised the Multi-National Club through a new logo, strengthening cross-cultural participation, inclusivity, and community belonging aligned with MCAS's outreach objectives.

Conducted a large-scale in-house talk in collaboration with Muwasolah SG, featuring Habib Musa Al-Kazhim Bin Ja'far Al-Saggaf, **attracting 390 registrations** and utilising multiple venue spaces concurrently.

A total of \$392,206 was disbursed under the monthly financial assistance schemes for Fakir/Miskin (Family, Chronic, Lifelong, and Foreign Convert Welfare Fund), benefiting 117 convert clients.





Education

Rebranded **DACCnDAYS** to **AKYL**, adopting a **fully subsidised model** that included transport, meals, uniforms, and textbooks, while strengthening parent partnerships through PSGs, orientations, and PTMs.

Launched **My First Qiyam** for new Converts and **conducted Zakat Workshops (Beginner & Intermediate)** for Converts, the public, asatizah, and amils.

Key education programmes (INTRIQ, INSTIL, FIRST, and FIQS) concluded with **high completion rates, full Convert participation, and zero fee arrears, alongside fee waivers** for Converts attending the Marriage Guidance Course.

Held the **Inaugural Academic Excellence Award Ceremony**, showcasing Project SEED and conferring the Diamond Award upon the late Prof. Dato' Dr. Muhammad Nur Manuty.

The **Teachers' Training & Development 2025 advanced inclusive, neuro-affirming practices**, with Universal Design for Learning (UDL) strategies embedded through classroom templates and action plans.



Finance

Partnered with Maybank to **host a donor appreciation event** and launch the Converts Entrepreneurship Programme, **raising \$69,515**.

The Green Gain Movement, launched with Renewed Resources, **combined sustainability and fundraising, raising \$3,866 through recyclable donations**.

Successfully **raised \$2,636 for the Live Qurban initiative**, conducted in collaboration with Pertapis on 7 June 2025, offering Converts a meaningful firsthand spiritual experience of the Qurban ritual.

The Gift of Qurban programme raised \$14,133, distributing 900 packets of infaq meat, groceries, and vouchers to needy families and Converts, strengthening compassion and inclusion.

Organised the Asyura Porridge Distribution with 16 mosques, **distributing 8,000 bowls and raising \$2,985 for outreach efforts**.

The **45th Anniversary Gala Dinner raised \$26,850 in sponsorships**, supporting programme delivery and marking a landmark celebration of MCAS's legacy and community impact.



Compliance with the Code of Governance

MCAS Darul Arqam is committed to maintaining the highest standards of governance, integrity, and accountability in the delivery of its mission. Strong governance ensures that our programmes remain sustainable and that resources are managed responsibly to benefit Converts and the wider Muslim community.

MCAS Darul Arqam is governed by a Council elected in accordance with the Association's Constitution. The Council provides strategic direction, oversees policy development, and ensures that the organisation operates in compliance with all statutory and regulatory requirements. The General Manager and Senior Management Team are responsible for executing the organisation's strategy, implementing effective internal controls, and ensuring operational excellence.

MCAS Darul Arqam adheres to the Code of Governance for Charities. The organisation has completed the annual Governance Evaluation Checklist (GEC) and submitted it to the Commissioner of Charities via the Charity Portal.

Key governance policies in place include:

- Conflict of Interest Policy requiring all Council members, committee members, and staff to declare actual or potential conflicts annually and as they arise.
- Whistleblowing Policy that provides secure channels for reporting misconduct.
- Reserves Policy that ensures financial sustainability and long-term operational viability.
- Risk Management and Business Continuity Measures, which include safeguarding data, essential services, and critical functions.
- Internal Controls covering procurement, financial approvals, data protection, and programme oversight.
- Regular Council and Committee Meetings, with attendance tracked to ensure effective oversight.

To strengthen organisational sustainability, MCAS Darul Arqam continues to invest in digital systems, staff capability building, and improved workflows to ensure services remain efficient, reliable, and future-ready.

MCAS Darul Arqam remains committed to upholding integrity, promoting transparency, and ensuring that every contribution entrusted to us is used to maximise community impact.





At the MCST 1677 Annual General Meeting on 26 April 2025, staff member Bro Muhammad Haziq Bin Roslan was appointed as Chairman, while Bro Razali Tompong was reappointed as a Council Member.

Extraordinary General Meeting (EOGM)

Following the Registrar of Societies' approval of the Constitutional Amendments on 24 June 2025, which revised the maximum Council size to 17 members, an Extraordinary General Meeting (EOGM) was convened on 31 August 2025, as the Council then comprised 24 members. Members approved the existing Council to continue serving its full term until the 2026 Council election, ensuring governance continuity while allowing time to align with the amended Constitution.

The EOGM affirmed MCAS Darul Arqam's commitment to transparency, good governance, and regulatory compliance.

45th Annual General Meeting

MCAS Darul Arqam convened its 45th Annual General Meeting (AGM) on 15 March 2025. At the meeting, members formally adopted the minutes of the 44th AGM held on 17 March 2024, as well as the Annual Report and the Management and Financial Statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2024.

Members also deliberated on and approved the proposed amendments to the MCAS Darul Arqam Constitution, following due presentation and discussion.

Programme Evaluation of MCAS Darul Arqam's One-Stop-Centre for Converts Services

The Programme Evaluation of MCAS Darul Arqam's One-Stop-Centre for Converts Services (OSCC) project was conducted based on the proposal agreed between MCAS Darul Arqam and Centre for Research on Islamic and Malay Affairs (RIMA), with support from MUIS. The objective was to assess the effectiveness, relevance, and delivery of OSCC services in supporting converts, and to identify areas for improvement. MCAS Darul Arqam commissioned RIMA to undertake the research and supported the study through data access, stakeholder engagement, and facilitation of surveys, interviews, and focus group discussions. RIMA led the research, analysis, and reporting, concluding the study in late 2025. MCAS Darul Arqam is currently reviewing RIMA's findings and recommendations to inform future enhancements to OSCC services.

The One-Stop Centre for Convert Services (OSCC) provides comprehensive support to Converts by covering the following areas:

- Conversion administration, including the conversion ceremony and issuance of conversion cards
- Reimbursements for essential conversion-related expenses such as transport, circumcision, and identity card update fees
- Foundational education, encouraging attendance at MCAS Darul Arqam foundation classes to build essential Islamic knowledge

In addition, MCAS Darul Arqam supports ongoing learning and development through access to advanced courses, talks, and programmes that support lifelong learning and spiritual growth. Together, these services ensure holistic administrative, educational, and developmental support for Converts.



External Courses

Arqam Kids and Youth Learning (AKYL)

Arqam Kids and Youth Learning (AKYL), formerly Darul Arqam Children Classes & Darul Arqam Youth School (DACCnDAYS), is a weekend madrasah for children and youth aged 7 to 17. Conducted on Sunday mornings, the programme primarily serves children of Converts and is open to the wider Muslim community.

AKYL delivers foundational Islamic knowledge, Quranic literacy, and values-based education within a structured and supportive learning environment. The programme adopts a pastorally sensitive approach to address the specific needs of children from Convert families, including identity development and practical application of faith.

Quran & Qasidah

The Quran & Qasidah spiritual enrichment programme is an initiative launched in April 2025 to provide a consistent platform for Quranic reflection and devotional expression through qasidah. The programme recorded its highest attendance in June 2025, coinciding with the new Hijri year, with 50 participants, of whom approximately 50% were Converts. The initiative demonstrated steady community interest and contributed to sustained religious engagement among Converts and the wider Muslim community.



Calm to Qiyam

Calm to Qiyam introduced night prayers to 40 participants, half of whom were Converts, at Khalid Mosque. Later scaled to As-Syakirin Mosque and An-Nahdhah Mosque, Youth of Darul Arqam (YODA) members facilitated sessions, increasing access, guidance, and sustained engagement in Qiyam, particularly for first-time participants.



YODA Facilitation Workshop



The YODA Facilitation Workshop was conducted on 31 May 2025 and facilitated by Andre Kwek (Adam Abdullah). The workshop aimed to equip youths with essential facilitation skills, focusing on effective engagement, communication, and group dynamics.

A total of 18 youths participated, including youths from other youth organisations, creating opportunities for cross-community networking and new friendships. The workshop received positive feedback from participants, who found the session engaging, practical, and beneficial for their personal and leadership development.

The English Islamic Bookshop (EIB)

Ramadan Storytelling

EIB collaborated with YODA volunteers and Homely Hammock during Ramadan 2025 this year for our storytelling sessions and had Ms Dalifah as well.



External Engagements

Social Support & Welfare Services

Ramadan Zakat Disbursement

The annual Zakat Ramadan Disbursement on 23 March, supported 500 families. A total of \$240,000 was disbursed.



Gift of Qurban

On 29 June, MCAS organised the Gift of Qurban initiative, supported by Hezom International, PERGAS and Al-Falah Academy Singapore, distributing 1,200 kg of Qurban meat and grocery packs to 308 families. The event was graced by Ms Diana Pang, Member of Parliament for Geylang Serai (Marine Parade–Braddell Heights) GRC. In addition, the Association conducted a live Qurban programme in collaboration with Pertapis.



Hands for Hope: Youth at Work, Hearts in Service

Hands for Hope, held on 24 August 2025, is a community service initiative that engages youth volunteers to support converts and underserved families through practical acts, such as home cleaning. The programme had up to 40 participants, fostering empathy, teamwork, and social responsibility, with many youths expressing interest in future involvement.



Muslimah Talk – Beneath the Veil: Whispers of Her Inner Strength

Held on 12 October 2025 at The Cove, City Plaza, the Beneath the Veil: Whispers of Her Inner Strength brought together 220 women, of whom approximately 80% were Muslim converts. Featuring Assoc Prof Razwana Begum, Ustazah Dr Alaniah Wahid, Ms Roszian Roslan, and Mdm Irwani Asad, the programme provided a supportive and reflective platform addressing women's inner strength, identity, and resilience within their faith journey.



Convert Jenazah Programme

Launched in 2022, the Convert Jenazah Assistance Programme continued in 2025, offering financial and emotional support to Converts and their families. Project Ansar volunteers and DCC staff provided guidance on religious procedures and emotional support during Islamic burial rites.

Home Visits

Project Ansar Home Visits provided sustained, ground-level support to converts and their families throughout the year. Each month, **40 volunteers**, working in pairs or trios, conducted visits to **40 homes**, rotating among **117 Financial Assistance (FA) clients**. These visits enabled regular check-ins on well-being, companionship, and assessment of household conditions, with insights informing timely follow-up support, including referrals to Hands for Hope and further support for home refurbishment and essential household improvements.

Legal Clinic

Legal Clinic sessions are conducted free-of-charge, by MCAS volunteer lawyers. The service is provided for MCAS members and the public. 44 cases were handled by the legal clinic in 2025.

1 Harmonizing Families: Workshop for In-Laws

SPEAKER: Ustaz Sufian Hanafi

SYNOPSIS: Interracial marriages are commonplace in this day and the role of extended families is vital as the pillar of support during times of joy and adversity. The workshop will explore the family dynamics to deepen appreciation for familial relationships and gain understanding of boundaries.

FOCUS AREAS: Focused on maintaining respect and building positive relationships with in-laws guided by Islamic principles, developing strategies to manage expectations and set boundaries in multi-generational households, and addressing conflicts with empathy to foster a culture of mutual support and understanding.



2 Healing Together: Domestic Violence in Our Communities


SPEAKER: Mdm Zaharah Ariff & Mdm Irwani Asad

SYNOPSIS: This workshop explores the different forms of family violence and their impact on individuals and communities. Grounded in Islamic teachings of justice, compassion, and the sanctity of relationships, it offers practical guidance on prevention, early intervention, and where to seek help.

FOCUS AREAS: To create safer, more supportive homes rooted in love and respect. This includes providing guidance for those who have experienced abuse or wish to break harmful patterns, fostering healing, growth, and positive change, and cultivating a culture of mutual support within the family.



Social & Recreational Activities



MNC Gatherings

MCAS Darul Arqam hosts monthly gatherings of Multi-National Clubs (MNCs), offering Converts the chance to connect and build friendships within their own ethnicities and nationalities for social support. These gatherings bring together communities from Indonesia, Mabuhay, Myanmar, China, India, Japan, and Vietnam, fostering a sense of belonging and shared experience among attendees.



YODA Youth Connect

The YODA Youth Connect event, held on 22 February 2025, brought together youths from diverse backgrounds and organisations to foster connection, collaboration, and creative expression. Participants contributed individual art pieces through doodling and painting, which were later combined into a collective mural themed "Compassion in Action." The event attracted over 70 youth sign-ups, including Project SEED recipients as well as students from local universities and polytechnics. The final artwork symbolised unity, shared values, and the power of collective effort.



Post Conversion Reception



The Post Conversion Reception sessions engaged over 50 attendees across 3 runs, the majority of whom were new Converts within their first year of conversion, many accompanied by family members or friends. Supported by Project Ansar volunteers, the receptions provided a welcoming space for connection, peer support, and introduction to MCAS Darul Arqam's programmes and resources, strengthening post-conversion engagement within the community.

The sessions also provided a safe space for Converts to share their journeys with fellow new Converts. In one session, a Vietnamese Convert, Davis Nguyen Huu Duoc @ Muneeb, shared his journey from taking his shahadah and attending MCAS beginner programmes to volunteering at MCAS Ramadan iftar initiatives, offering inspiration and encouragement to others.

Chinese New Year Gathering

On 9 February, the Association held its annual Chinese New Year Gathering at the Auditorium, coordinated by the Chinese Multi-National Club (MNC), with over 100 participants in attendance. The programme featured interactive quizzes and performances, and concluded with a traditional lo hei session followed by lunch, fostering community interaction and social cohesion.



Muslimah Bonding Trip

The Muslimah Bonding Trip 2025, an event under Women's Wing, held on 27 July 2025, provided a structured opportunity for rest, reflection, and social connection among volunteers, Council members, and staff. The initiative supported mental well-being, promoted relaxation, and strengthened meaningful bonds, while recognising the contributions of Muslimah volunteers. The programme was attended by 71 participants, with more than 50% comprising Converts, reinforcing inclusivity and sustained volunteer engagement.



One Big Step

Each quarter, we feature Converts sharing their personal journeys as Muslims. We actively encourage our Converts to speak up and share their experiences and insights so that others may benefit and be inspired. For example, two Converts shared their experiences of performing haj, the Fifth Pillar of Islam, offering valuable reflections on this profound spiritual journey.

The MCAS 45th Anniversary Gala Dinner, held on 23 November 2025, marked a significant milestone in the Association's history, commemorating 45 years of service to the Muslim Convert community and wider society. The event was attended by 562 guests, including current and former members, donors, educators, mosque leaders, volunteers, partners from across the Asia-Pacific region, and friends of MCAS Darul Arqam, providing an opportunity to reflect on the organisation's growth and achievements in Convert care, education, and outreach.

A key highlight was the Golden Ticket segment, in which selected Converts received full sponsorship to perform Umrah with MCAS. The programme also featured a special tribute to pioneers and long-serving volunteers whose dedication has shaped the organisation's development. The Gala Dinner reaffirmed MCAS Darul Arqam's ongoing commitment to compassion, inclusivity, and community cohesion.





Inaugural Umrah Programme

MCAS Darul Arqam successfully organised its inaugural Umrah programme, marking a key organisational milestone. The programme was designed to support Converts and first-time pilgrims through a structured and guided Umrah experience.

The programme was fully conducted in English, ensuring accessibility for participants from diverse backgrounds. A total of 81 pilgrims participated, inclusive of staff and applicants. Of these, 31 participants were Golden Ticket holders, comprising MCAS Financial Assistance Converts as well as Converts facing financial difficulties who expressed a strong desire to perform the umrah and their children

who received full sponsorship support. The sponsorship framework was implemented to reduce financial barriers, promote equitable access to religious obligations, and align with MCAS Darul Arqam's welfare and financial-assistance objectives.

The Umrah journey spanned 12 days, comprising 6 days in Makkah and 6 days in Madinah. Pilgrims were accompanied by 7 MCAS staff, some of whom served as mutawwifs, providing on-ground guidance, pastoral care, and programme coordination. The delegation was led by MCAS President, Bro Imran Kuna and Council Member, Bro Khaleel Chan, alongside 4 other Council

members. These Council members are Converts undertaking umrah for the first time. The pilgrimage-related expenses for the Council members were borne by the Association.

In addition to financial sponsorship, in-kind welfare support was provided to eligible participants to ensure preparedness and ease of travel. This included checked luggage, duffle bags, tote bags, wudhu spray bottles, ihram sets, telekung, and other essential pilgrimage items. These provisions reduced out-of-pocket expenses, supported logistical readiness, and ensured a dignified and consistent pilgrimage experience for sponsored pilgrims.

Beyond the core Umrah rites, the programme included guided visits to key historical

and religious landmarks, including Cave of Hira, Jannat al-Mu'alla, Jannat al-Baqi, Badr, Uhud, Taif, and other significant sites. These visits supported religious literacy and contextual learning, complementing the spiritual objectives of the pilgrimage. Overall, the programme demonstrated responsible financial stewardship, targeted deployment of cash and in-kind sponsorships, and integrated religious and welfare support, reinforcing MCAS Darul Arqam's commitment to providing holistic, needs-based assistance for Converts.
